 - Provide expertise on assessment-informed instruction and practices and analyze and report on student literacy data.

Literacy Coaches are assigned client projects as client needs are known. A typical client project consists of 3 or more schools, and service delivery timeframe is adjusted accordingly. Throughout the school year, and based on availability of on-site resources, you will provide weekly support to educators. Coaching and support sessions are delivered over approximately 60 hours to each single school, average 2 hours per week, throughout the school year. In addition, you will spend time on preparation and internal meetings as required. Travel may be required, should clients require in person workshops or training, and will range between 1-2 weeks over the course of a given school year. May require travel to remote locations – key geographic locations of travel include Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Northern Ontario.
